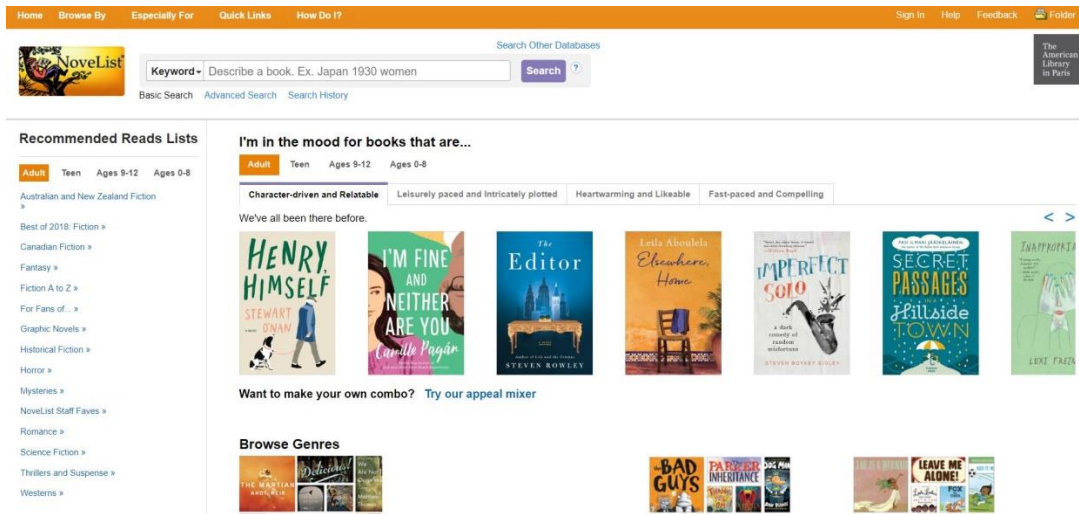




To access NoveList click on the eResources page of the American Library website. Select NoveList from the menu. (Be sure to login with your American Library credentials).

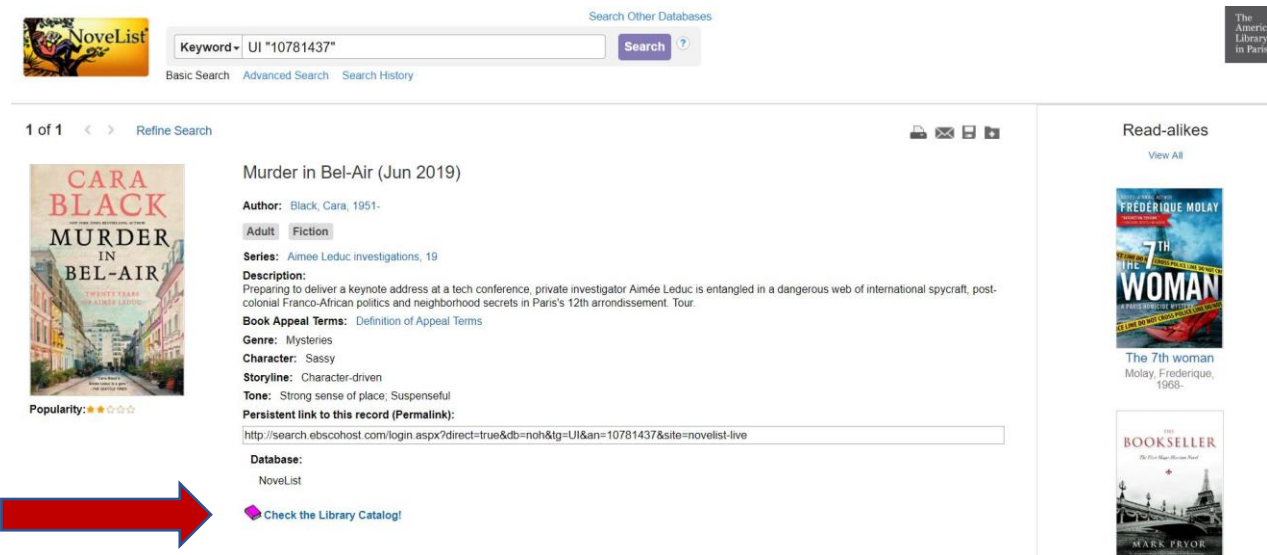

Step 2. In the right corner of the page you can sign in to be able to save your search results. You can sign in with your Google account or sign in with an account you created with EBSCOhost. To create an account, you can do that by clicking “create one now” below sign in.



Step 3. You can search Novelist by using the search bar at the top of the page. You have the option to do a keyword, title, author and series search. You can click on the advanced search options and check your search history.



Step 4. When you find a book that you are interested in click on the title of the book. You are given a description of the book and the option to see if the book is available at the American Library.

Summary: Aimée Leduc is about to go onstage to give the keynote address at a tech conference that is sure to secure Leduc Detective some much-needed business contracts when she gets an emergency phone call from her daughter's playgroup: Aimée's own mother, who was supposed to pick up Chloé, never showed. 


