## THE LIBRARY'S YEAR

The year 1964 promised to be rich in new developments for the American Library in Paris, and indeed it was.

Evicted, but with a decent indemnity, from a building grown too small and tired on the Champs-Élysées, we found exactly what we needed for a permanent, purchased home almost under the Eiffel Tower. It was an enormous and empty Navy warehouse, all on a ground floor, with a vast dry cellar. Thanks to hard and intelligent work by many people, led by a bright young English decorator-contractor, those cavernous spaces were transformed in four months into the most stunningly modern and functional library in Paris.

Our 100,000 books were moved exactly on schedule, and we opened our new doors on September 28, after having closed at the Champs-Élysées just one week earlier. The new Library building was inaugurated by Ambassadors Charles Bohlen and Henri Bonnet on October 16.

Now, for our 45th year, we are for the first time in a building we own, with all our books and services under one roof. This means that we are performing better our function as library for the recently-created American College in Paris, and entering on an era of more effective service for the hundreds of readers in 18 countries who depend on our Department for the Blind books in braille, on records, and on tape.

We remain, of course, and more efficiently than ever, the great research center for American studies in Europe, as well as the source of reading pleasure for thousands of borrowers representing 40 nationalities. Our branches in Toulouse, Montpellier, Grenoble and Nantes still function well, the only American libraries in the French provinces since the U. S. Information Service abandoned its centers last year.

There is much work to be done, a fine staff to do it, and an efficient plant to do it in. On the next page, we shall tell you how we managed it financially.

## "Libraries are not self-supporting . . ."

In 1964, we had two separate budgets: the regular, though not quite normal, budget for the day-to-day operation of the Library; and a separate budget to cover the purchase of our new building, its reconditioning, and our moving.

On the operating budget, we spent \$92,929.51. Of this sum, \$51,868.00 went for payroll; \$13,880.76 for building and other current expenses; \$6,436.59 to maintain our New York office; \$11,236.90 for the operation of our Toulouse and Nantes branches; and \$9,507.26 for the purchase of books and magazine subscriptions.

On the income side, borrowers' fees, fines, and partial refund of expenses incurred for the operation of our branches in the provinces brought in \$31,696.36; and our income from investments was \$3,448.00.

This left \$57,785.11 to be raised through donations and special projects. Fund raising in Paris brought in \$17,931.00 — and in the United States, \$32,574.10, for a total of \$50,505.10. The gap between what we needed to raise and what we did manage to raise, \$7,280.01, was filled by reducing the surplus with which we opened the year.

On the building budget, the total cost of buying the building, reconditioning it, and moving the Library was approximately \$700,000. To meet this, we sold our Endowment Fund securities for \$315,078.90,

and we received \$132,650 as an indemnity for leaving our old building. This left a gap of about \$250,000. Donations for the Building Fund amounted to \$107,022.53, of which two-thirds came from friends in France. Dividends and profits on stock sales have brought in \$7,529.54 more. We hope to sell the lease for a portion of the building that we do not need for Library purposes for about \$50,000. The present position, therefore, is that we shall need about \$85,000 more in gifts to be free and clear. Then we shall start re-accumulating an Endowment Fund, for which we already have an initial gift of \$50.

## REPORT ON THE GOURMET - ARCHITECTURAL TOUR IN FRANCE

1964

In October, 1964, Mr. and Mrs. John G. McCarthy led a group comprising 27 people on a wine tour of the Champagne, Burgundy and Loire regions of France with the proceeds accruing to the benefit of the Library. Mr. Daniel Hopping lectured on the architectural aspects of the regions visited and Mr. Peter Fleming acted as general co-director of the tour.

The group assembled in Paris on October 1st and participated in some special events arranged in Paris before their departure on the trip. Mr. and Mrs. Jacques Mauger gave a reception and tea at their town house in Villa Spontini following a fashion show at Castillo and made a generous financial contribution to the Library stemming from the results of the show.

On Sunday morning Dean Sturgis Riddle, following a special invitation to services at the American Pro-Cathedral, received the group with Mrs. Riddle at the Deanery. Following this reception the Trustees of the Library entertained the group at

a magnificent luncheon at the Cercle Interallié with the Duke and Duchess of Windsor in attendance. Mr. Robert H. Blake, President of the Board of Trustees of the Library welcomed the group and Dr. Ian Fraser discussed the work and purposes of the Library and its new home. The Duke of Windsor made a charming speech wishing the tour a very good journey.

On Monday morning, October 4th, the group left Paris and arrived via Compiègne at Biérancourt where Miss Eve Dahlgren and Mrs. Johnson Garrett hosted a superb luncheon party at the Anne Morgan Museum on a glorious Indian Summer day. After lunch the party took the Route du Champagne through the region of the Marne to Rheims where the first night was spent at the Hotel du Lion D'Or.

The following morning after a visit to Rheims cathedral the group assembled at the abbey of Dom Perignon in Hautvillers where it was met by Count Raoul Chandon Moët and conducted to the house of Moët and Chandon in Epernay. Following a reception at the Moët and Chandon pavillon with Countess de Maigret and Count Chandon Moët as hosts a glorious luncheon was served at the beautiful Orangerie of Moët and Chandon. There followed a visit to the caves and an inspection of the various steps in the champagne-making process.

In the late afternoon the group left Epernay for Burgundy and spent the next three days visiting vineyards and caves in that region including a visit to the Clos de Vougeot where representatives of the Confrérie des Chevaliers du Tastevin received them.

Following their departure from Beaune the party proceeded to Vézèley via Saulieu with a stop at the Côte D'Or for lunch. At Vézèley a beautiful reception was held for the group at the fascinating house of Miss and Mr. Thum and that evening a special Son et Lumière was presented at the famous Abbey Church through the assistance of Mr. Georges Lourau despite the fact that the season had officially ended.

The following day the party left for the Loire and "wine breaks" were registered at Pouilly sur Loire and Sancerre en route to luncheon at Valençay and the Chateaux of the Loire. After Valençay a visit was made to Loches on the way to the Chateau d'Artigny at Montbazou where the party spent the next four nights. Day trips included Chenonceaux, Azay-le-Rideau, Angers, Saumur, Montgeffroi, Fontevault, Chinon, Tours and other highlights. A trip was made to taste the wines of Vouvray and a truly memorable visit to the Chateau de Villandry where M. & Madame François Carvello gave a tour of their historic and fabulous gardens by day-light, followed by a beautiful reception and party in the

chateau with many of their chateau-owning neighbors on hand, and with a special Son et Lumière of the gardens and Chateau after the reception.

The Chateau d'Artigny later that evening witnessed an historic Bal de Tête until the small hours of the morning. The next day the group departed for lunch at the charming Manor house of Mr. and Mrs. Karl S. Cate near Dreux en route to Paris which provided a delightful break in the day's run and one of the highlights of the trip.

On the return of the party to Paris Mr. and Mrs. Johnson Garrett gave a splendid dinner party at their historic apartment on the Isle de la Cité; and the next day the opening of the new Paris headquarters of the Library at 10 Rue Camou with the American Ambassador Charles Bohlen and Ambassador Henri Bonnet inaugurating the building and with Dr. Fraser and many other friends of the Library on hand provided an impressive climax to the Tour.
