

## **PROFESSIONAL ACTIVITIES**

Adele D. Witt, Assistant Director, remained active with the VTLS European Users Group (VTLS is the Library's automation system). She attended a one-day seminar in December. Monique Bidinger, the Library's accountant, took a course that covered changes in the employment law and their implementation.

#### EVENINGS WITH AN AUTHOR

Evenings with an Author take place one or two Wednesday evenings a month, except in July and August. They are free and open to the public, thanks to the generous support of the Annenberg Foundation.

The San Francisco theatre troupe Word for Word performed The Gilded Six-Bits, by Zora Neale Hurston. The troupe performs well-known works of short fiction in their entirety, as written, word for word. The program was made possible by a grant from the Florence Gould Foundation, with additional support from Air France, the European Benefits Group, and the Annenberg Foundation.

Charles Langner Robertson, discussed what befell Americans and American institutions in Paris during the Nazi occupation, a topic on which he has done extensive research for a manuscript in progress.

Hans Gallas spoke at the opening of the exhibit "We Love You, Alice B. Toklas: A 125th Birthday Celebration"—books, letters, photographs, and other ephemera from his Alice B. Toklas and Gertrude Stein collections. The exhibit was housed in the Library's special exhibits area, a gift of the Florence Gould Foundation.

Annie Cohen-Solal served as Cultural Counselor at the French embassy in the United States and produced the radio series "Painters for the New World" for FranceCulture. The French edition of her book Painting American was awarded the Prix Bernier by the Académie de Beaux Arts. Her discussion focused on the rise of American artists on both sides of the Atlantic, a phenomenon fueled by fascinating personalities and supported by the rising strength of American industry.

Anne Conover read from her intimate portrait Olga Rudge and Ezra Pound, which has been acclaimed by critics in the United States. Rudge, a talented concert violinist, had a tempestuous relationship with Pound that lasted until the end of his life, which Conover's book explores in depth

André Pécoud was a children's book illustrator in the 1920s; his drawings were on display from mid-June through August.

Ruth Mastron and Gilles Asselin are the entertaining authors of Au Contraire! Figuring Out the French. Their book provides perspective on what happens when Americans and the French come together at work, at home, and in social settings. Their entertaining program always draws a crowd, and this author event was no exception.

Annabel Simms has explored the countryside around Paris for more than ten years. Her discoveries of half-hidden chateaux, of old towns and country footpaths, and cozy little restaurants known only to locals are enchantingly described in An Hour from Paris. Another popular and well-attended event!

Leonard Pitt, connoisseur of Paris and all her sidestreets and back streets, gave a slide presentation of Promenades dans le Paris Disparu—a remarkable side-by-side exposé of buildings and streets (before and after scenes) that have disappeared or been changed beyond recognition over the years, from before Haussmann through the 1980s.

Jacques Richardson, author of War, Science and Terrorism, read passages from his text and discussed the involvement of the sciences and social sciences in the increasingly sophisticated art of warfare, whether by governments or individuals.

Suggestions for programs and contacts with authors passing through Paris to promote new books are provided by numerous agents, bookstores, publishers, and individuals.





# CHILDREN AND YOUNG ADULTS

In 2002, 2,500 children participated in the Children's Programs offered at the Library. ONGOING PROGRAMS

- Twice a Month Mother Goose Lap-sit for Toddlers
- Weekly children's Story Hour
- Saturdays are special: Programs for Older Children
- Class Visits to the Library

These ongoing programs had 2,077 participants.

SUMMER READING PROGRAM

The fourth annual Sizzling Summer Reading Program, Jump into Reading, attracted 171 young readers between 3 and 12 years of age. Children received stickers for reading books, and a certificate and prizes at the "End of Summer" Celebration.

#### GROUP PROGRAMS

The Library continued to sponsor an English language program for children from L'Association a travers la Ville, a group which helps children at risk. This year the children created and produced a cartoon in English and French.

The Library also provided programs and story times for children from surrounding French and bilingual schools and organizations, including La Providence, L'Ecole d'Aujourd'hui, the Lennen Bilingual School, Eurécole, AAWE, Message, and Bloom Where You're Planted.

There were 252 participants in these group programs.
