DVD collection makeover



Movie lovers might have noticed a change in our DVD collection's appearance lately. In order to provide easier and more userfriendly browsing, librarians and volunteers

are currently reclassifying our 2500-title DVD collection. From now on you will find titles organized by genre, in one of six categories: Action, Comedy, Drama, Television, **Documentaries**, and **Music**. In each category, titles are ordered alphabetically by director's name (or musician's name, or TV series title).

Signage describes what is included in each of these generic categories (for example, you will find adventure and sci-fi under 'action,' miniseries and stand-up comedy under 'TV,' music videos, concerts, ballet/opera under



'Music'). There is also a self-instruction category, including exercise DVDs, language-learning methods on CD or DVD, and computer instruction on CD-ROM at a later stage.

Nothing has changed in the way titles are described in the online catalog - if you are looking for a title in particular, the catalog is still the most efficient tool to find what you want. The staff would like to thank volunteers Scott Napoli, David Thompson, Christel Prestige, and Ellen Lebelle for their tremendous help, and all patrons for their patience during this work-in-progress.

Lastly, we need your help! Since many DVDs are lost and replaced each year due to rough wear-and-tear, we would like to remind you to <u>please</u> take special care of the DVD discs and cases in order to ensure future use and to help us reduce the growing cost of replacing damaged items.
