A special evening with Justice Anthony Kennedy

The Honorable Justice Anthony M. Kennedy of the United States Supreme Court spoke to guests of the American Library on 2 July at the George C. Marshall Center. Justice Kennedy, on a private visit to Paris, informally discussed the work of the court and the process of reaching closure on decisions.



In the 25 years on the Supreme Court, Kennedy has become a key swing vote and a significant author of major opinions. Just the week before his Library appearance, he wrote the majority opinions on the Voting Rights Act and on the marriage equality cases, in the first instance voting with court conservatives, in the latter instance voting with court liberals.

We close out our event season on Wednesday <u>17 July</u> with Ta-Nehisi Coates, a senior editor of *The Atlantic Magazine* and author of the superb 2008 memoir *The Beautiful Struggle: A Father, Two Sons, and an Unlikely Road to Manhood.* Coates writes

about race in America today, the legacy of the Civil War as well as popular culture. He is spending part of the summer in Paris to learn French, and will talk to us about current events in the United States and how learning a foreign language has reignited his imagination.
