A biography of Jesus, the 2012 PISA studies, and Library wine-tasting

It's a rare book that has something new and compelling to add to the conversation about the origins of Christianity, yet religion scholar and author Reza Aslan has written a great one. He will present his critically-acclaimed and controversial book, Zealot: The Life and Times of Jesus of Nazareth on Sunday 23 March at 19h30. Note the special day of this author event. On Tuesday 1 April at 19h30, the OECD explores the results of the widely-discussed 2012 PISA studies. "What is important for citizens to know and be able to do?" That is the question that underlies the triennial survey of over 500,000 15-year-old students from 65 countries around the world undertaken by the OECD. The assessment, which focuses on reading, mathematics, science and problem-solving, does not just



ascertain whether students possess the knowledge; it also examines how well students can extrapolate from what they have learned and apply that knowledge in unfamiliar settings. Read what The New York Times wrote about the implications of the 2012 PISA studies, and come join in on the conversation.
