Pop-up Book as Art exhibit

We love books in every shape and form at the Library! This special exhibition called Pop-up Book as Art is a display of pop-up books created by children ages 7-10 during a hands-on workshop led by illustrator and designer Ann Bruce Hénaff. Participants in the workshop created a pop-up book, using a theme of stripes and dots, and original characters to accompany the structure. The pop-up structures can be read



like a book and also disassembled and reconfigured as a 3D architectural piece.

Access to the exhibit is free to Library members, as well as users with a Library day or week pass. Come and visit the exhibit from now until Sunday 8 June.
