## **Library Fellow Susan Hiner**

The Library's fourth Visiting Fellow, Susan Hiner, will be with us for the month of June. Hiner is a professor of French and Francophone Studies at Vassar College. Her research and teaching interests include women and material culture in nineteenth-century France, fashion studies, and the intersection of literature, visual culture, and social history.



She will speak at the Library on Tuesday 16 June on the subject of her 2010 book *Accessories to Modernity: Fashion and the Feminine in Nineteenth-Century France.* Her discussion will include fashion history through the prism of the arts and how it affected the bourgeois idealization of womanhood in that era. Her book looks at how style was portrayed in works by Zola, Flaubert, and Balzac and how that reflected society at large.
