Stars of literature and music

Library evening programs kick off on Wednesday 9 September with Tash Aw, a Malaysian-born writer who lives in London and writes in English. His latest novel, Five-Star Billionaire was longlisted for the Man Booker Prize in 2013. His first book, The Harmony Silk Factory, won the Whitbread Book Award for First Novel Award. Since then, Aw has also published the acclaimed book Map of the Invisible World.



On Wednesday 16 September, the Library is thrilled to welcome the legendary British singer and actress Marianne Faithfull for a conversation with programs manager Grant Rosenberg about her career, her music and her love of literature.
