## A new chairman of the board

Luis Roth was elected chairman of the Library board on 15 June. He succeeds Mary Lee Turner, chairman since 2012, who will exchange positions with Roth and become vice chairman of the Library's governing body. The board also elected a new secretary, Forrest Alogna, who became a trustee last year, and welcomed three new members: Leslie de Galbert, Stephanie de la Rochefoucauld, and Sophie-Caroline de Margerie.



Roth is a partner in the Paris offices of international law firm Linklaters LLP and has served on the board since 2009. A graduate of Andover, Yale, and Columbia Law School, Roth also serves on the vestry, or governing body, of the American Cathedral in Paris.

Elected for another three-year term on the board were Roth, Turner, Rob Johnson, René de Monseignat, and Nadine Voisin.

## The winners of the 2016 YAFF

The 2016 Young Authors Fiction Festival culminated with a celebration event on Friday 3 June at the American Church in Paris. Over 300 people attended the event, including the young author finalists, parents and teachers. Each finalist was awarded a certificate and the winning stories were published in a celebration booklet. The 2016 YAFF received 420 submissions, the largest intake in the festival's history, from over 25 schools and writing programs.

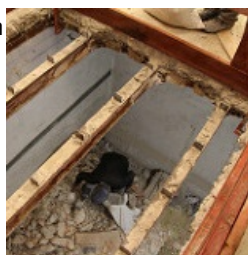
