French elections, women in science, Jacqueline Woodson, and artists' books

On <u>Wednesday 5 April</u>, join us for a panel discussion on the direction of the French presidential elections with journalists Guillemette Faure and Scott Sayare. With the first round of voting for the next French president later this month, there are many questions of how the political landscape is shifting. Both journalists will give their assessment of the stakes at hand.

On <u>Wednesday 12 April</u>, author and doctor Penny Noyce will present four centuries of remarkable women in science. Despite the expectations and social restrictions of their time, many women became pioneers in science and medicine. Noyce's talk will examine how women overcame their assigned status to contribute to science, with a special emphasis on

Woodson will also do a reading and Q&A on Saturday 29 April at 17h00 for children (ages 8+) with teens and adults welcome.

On Saturday 22 April at 14h00 in the conference room, join Ricardo Bloch, photographer and book artist, for a discussion on artists' books and conceptions of what a book can be. Special event with comedian Jim Gaffigan





The stories will now be sent to a panel of 60 judges and finalists will be notified in mid-May.
