The world of vinegar, history of Syria, and a WWI story

<u>Tonight</u>, Michael Harlan Turkell, an award-winning photographer and cookbook author, speaks about his delightful and fascinating book *Acid Trip: Travels in the World of Vinegar*, in conversation with food writer Lindsey Tramuta.

Mansel is a historian of France and the Middle East, specializing in courts and cities.

Longform magazine writing workshop

From mid-January through the end of March, visiting fellow James Verini will conduct a six-session writing workshop focused on longform magazine writing. He will instruct participants in how to develop magazine story ideas, report them, write them, and publish them. The course will include several preliminary writing assignments and a larger essay on a topic of each participant's choosing.

The course is open to aspiring and working magazine writers, members and nonmembers alike, and participants will be chosen based on a writing sample. Sign-ups for all six sessions, and the fee is $225 \in$.
