

African politics, David Lebovitz, wild ideas, and a story of friendship

Tonight, Library director Jeff Hawkins speaks with Nigerian cabinet minister Chibuike Rotimi Amaechi about sub-saharan Africa's largest country, Boko Haram and other security challenges, and Nigeria's relations with the United States. Amaechi, an influential leader from the oil-rich Niger Delta, was one of the primary architects of the ruling All Progressives Congress (APC) party and a key player in President Muhammadu Buhari's 2015 electoral victory.



On Wednesday 11 April, business thinker and author Nilofer Merchant presents her story-based book The Power of Onlyness: Make Your Wild Ideas Mighty Enough to Dent the World. She looks at how people can be more empowered in our modern age and how individuals can make an impact precisely through their individuality. Merchant is an expert in turning seemingly wild ideas into reality and shows the rest of us how

to do it through her books, her top-ranked TED talks, and her own experiences.

The stories will now be sent to a panel of 70 judges and finalists will be notified in towards the end of May.
