

The Library welcomes its latest Visiting Fellow, Vanessa Manko, from mid-April to mid-May. On Wednesday 25 April, Library Visiting Fellow Vanessa Manko will talk about the historical fiction that she is working on based on the life and work of Loie Fuller, an American modern dance and stage lighting pioneer who performed in Paris at the Folies-Bergère in the 1890s.


Vanessa Manko: Evenings with an Author
