The summer is drawing to a close, and the Library is gearing up for a new season. As of today, we are open full days, 10h00-19h00, Tuesday through Saturday, and Sundays from 13h00-19h00. Our nocturne begins next week, on 6 September: the Library closes at 22h00 on Thursday evenings.

The *rentrée* is busy for all of us, so save time by joining or <u>renewing</u> your membership online. You can pay the annual fee in 12 monthly installments or in a single payment. Membership fees only cover 25% of our operating costs, so please consider making a donation online as well.

Fall program highlights

We kick off the new events season on Wednesday 5 September with a special double documentary screening of At Home and Over There: American Women Physicians in World War I and The American in Paris: The True Story of the American Hospital of Paris in WWI. 
