Curbside Lending



As France lifts confinement restrictions this week, the Library is busy preparing for a progressive reopening and implementing comprehensive safety measures to protect our community members. As we begin the first phase of deconfinement, we are excited to launch a **curbside lending service** to ensure that our members have access to print material as soon as possible. *Please note that the Library's facilities remain closed presently.*

Our **curbside lending procedure** involves four steps:

1. Request books in the [online catalog](#)
2. Make an appointment to pick up your books using the [calendar](#)
3. Receive confirmation
4. Pick up your books at the Library

You are welcome to return books Tuesday-Friday, 14h00-17h30. No appointment is necessary for returns.

We will do our utmost to ensure the safety of everyone, including requiring that all staff and members wear masks during each appointment. All returning books will be quarantined before being put back into circulation. Don't forget to bring a bag, your Library card, and a required mask to your appointment. Consider purchasing our new, organic cotton centennial tote bag on our [website](#) when you make your appointment, or at the Library (exact change or *sans contact*

credit card payment only). It's a great way to support the Library and carry your books home in style.

All our programs and services will continue virtually for the present time. Please continue reading for upcoming virtual adult and children's and teens' programs.
