






# American Library in Paris Book Award: 2023 Longlist Announced

Ten titles have been selected for the longlist of the 2023 American Library in Paris Book Award. The \$5,000 literary prize, now celebrating its eleventh year, is given to a title originally published in English that best realizes new and intellectually significant ideas about France, the French people, or encounters with French culture. The award is supported by a generous grant from the Florence Gould Foundation.

A screening advisory panel chaired by **Rachel Donadio**, the award's administrator, selected the longlist from sixty-three nominees.

The 2023 five-title shortlist will be announced in September. The winning title will be selected by an independent jury: **Lauren Groff** (Chair), an award-winning novelist; **Doan Bui**, a French writer and journalist; and **Sudhir Hazareesingh**, a historian, academic, and 2021 winner of the American Library in Paris Book Award.

All sixty-three submissions for the 2023 Book Award are in the Library's circulating collection and are available for checkout by members.

The winner of the 2023 award will be announced at a ceremony on 9 November 2023. This event is the Library's most important donor appreciation event of the year.
