Each year, the program will underwrite two Visiting Fellows and three Scholars of Note, providing support that enables recipients to immerse themselves in the Library's vibrant intellectual community.

Clydette de Groot, who serves on the Library's fellowship selection committee, has been instrumental in shaping the Library's Fellowship program since its inception in 2013. Her vision and sustained commitment to creative exchange have guided the program's evolution from its early beginnings to this new named fellowship.

"The Library has always been a place where ideas travel freely and voices connect across borders," say the de Groots. "This fellowship continues that tradition by creating space for reflection, research, and human connection."

Executive Director Audrey Chapuis noted, "The de Groot Visiting Fellowship Program represents both continuity and growth—a testament to the de Groots' faith in the Library's mission and the power of literature to bridge cultures."

The de Groot Visiting Fellowship Program will launch in 2026, with applications opening in early spring 2026.
